To Whom it may concern:

I'm writing to you to get some clarification, understanding and to complain about the recent acts against my husband, [REDACTED] [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] is a parolee released in [REDACTED] of [REDACTED]. Since his release he has complied with all that has been asked of him. He recently lost his job and [REDACTED] placed under a monitor being told by his then [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] that he had too much time on his hand. He had no problem with that. Recently the monitor wasn't reading and someone came out to check the box and to replace the monitor on his ankle. The gentleman didn't indicate any problems other than battery life.

Days later [REDACTED] called his now [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] to ask permission to go to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] to get furniture he is being given. She told him no and that she should put him in jail for tampering with the monitor. He asked her "Why would I do that after all this time?", She said he [REDACTED] fine.

██████ didn't feel right with that and called to speak to someone in ██████ at the ██████ of pardons. When ██████ came around and he went in for his normal visit he ██████ apprehended. His ██████ ██████ told him that he shouldn't have gone over her head and that's why he's going back. She then made a joke of it to the driver saying "He had the nerve to ask me to go to ██████"

Don't we have a right to ask questions? Where in the laws does it say they can ██████ people in and out of prison to suit their mood? And this happens so often that the inmates have a name for it, being "Time Out". Are they children? Any employment opportunities he had coming up will be gone because of this.

Since then his ██████ ██████ has been to see him and had him sign papers regarding the tampering telling him that if he doesn't sign it will take longer for him to get out.

I called [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and left a message. She never called me back. On [REDACTED] [REDACTED] I called the [REDACTED] once again this time asking for [REDACTED] Mother's [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] rudely treated by a hispanic woman who answered the operator line and wouldn't give me her name. I work in [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and I wouldn't have a job if I spoke like that.

So from this one [REDACTED] [REDACTED] I see it's common practice to violate rights and disrespect people. I called the Waterbury [REDACTED] [REDACTED] in error and wasn't treated like this.

Because you make mistakes in life you shouldn't be treated like a human being? How are some of these [REDACTED] and women to rehabilitate when they have people knocking them back down? I guess this is how they keep their jobs? Is this the law? What's going to happen to me after I write this letter? Or will it be taken out on [REDACTED]

Please help me understand this.
