AN ACT REQUIRING ALL MARINAS TO BE EQUIPPED WITH PUMPING STATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. No person, firm, corporation or association shall operate any marina within this state after June 1, 1972, unless such marina is equipped with sufficient marine toilet pumping stations to serve the users of such marina.

Sec. 2. The commissioner of health shall on or before January 1, 1972 promulgate regulations specifying the number and type of pumping stations to be installed in marinas. Such regulations shall also specify how the waste materials removed from boats and vessels by such pumping stations are to be disposed of.

Sec. 3. Any person, firm, corporation or association violating the provisions of this act shall be fined one hundred dollars per day during the continuation of such violation.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE: To require that all marinas are equipped with pumping stations for the clearing of marine toilets.
