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AN ACT CONCERNING A COMMISSION ON STATE GOVERNMENT ORGANIZATION.

CONNECTICUT STATE LIBRARY LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Repferentiatives in 16 General Assembly convened: 17

Section 1. There shall be a commission of seven members to 18 study the state government's organization. The governor shall 20 appoint five members. The president pro tempore of the senate 21 shall appoint a state senator and the speaker of the house shall 22 appoint a state representative provided, however the legislative 23 members shall be of different political parties. No more than 25 four members of the commission shall be of the same political party.

Sec. 2. The commission shall study all the functions of the 26 shall examine the feasibility of state's government and 27 transferring some state government operations from the public to 28 the private sector. Said commission shall prepare a report with 29 its recommendations as to means by which to increase state 30 government efficiency and economy to the governor and the general 31 assembly not later than December 31, 1972.

Sec. 3. All agencies of the state shall cooperate with the 32 commission. It may acquire, on a contractual or other basis, 33 necessary secretarial, professional, technical and administrative 34 services within its appropriations.

Sec. 4. Members shall receive no compensation for their 35 services as such but shall be reimbursed for all reasonable 36 expenses incurred in the performance of their duties. 37

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Sec. 5. There shall be appropriated for necessary expenses 38 the sum of one hundred thousand dollars.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE: To have a small high powered commission of 42 seven members thoroughly review the conduct of the state's 43 administration and make recommendations to the governor and 44 legislature for more efficient and economical conduct of state 45 functions and the transfer of services where feasible to the 46 private sector.
