AN ACT CONCERNING A COMMISSION ON STATE GOVERNMENT ORGANIZATION.

CONNECTICUT

SECTION

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
General Assembly convened:

Section 1. There shall be a commission of seven members to  
study the state government's organization. The governor shall  
appoint five members. The president pro tempore of the senate  
shall appoint a state senator and the speaker of the house shall  
appoint a state representative provided, however the legislative  
members shall be of different political parties. No more than  
four members of the commission shall be of the same political  
party.

Sec. 2. The commission shall study all the functions of the  
state's government and shall examine the feasibility of  
transferring some state government operations from the public to  
the private sector. Said commission shall prepare a report with  
its recommendations as to means by which to increase state  
government efficiency and economy to the governor and the general  
assembly not later than December 31, 1972.

Sec. 3. All agencies of the state shall cooperate with the  
commission. It may acquire, on a contractual or other basis,  
necessary secretarial, professional, technical and administrative  
services within its appropriations.

Sec. 4. Members shall receive no compensation for their  
services as such but shall be reimbursed for all reasonable  
expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

Sec. 5. There shall be appropriated for necessary expenses 38  
the sum of one hundred thousand dollars. 39

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE: To have a small high powered commission of 42  
seven members thoroughly review the conduct of the state's 43  
administration and make recommendations to the governor and 44  
legislature for more efficient and economical conduct of state 45  
functions and the transfer of services where feasible to the 46  
private sector.
