AN ACT CONCERNING CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF CONNECTICUT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Section 30-1 of the general
2 statutes, as amended, is amended by adding
3 subdivision (26) as follows: "University" means
4 any college or university existing in the state.

5 Sec. 2. Section 30-15 of the general
6 statutes, as amended, is amended by adding
7 subdivision (u) as follows: University permit.

8 Sec. 3. A university permit shall allow the
9 retail sale of beer on land and in buildings which
10 are subject to the care, custody and control of
11 the governing board of any college or university.
12 Such beverages shall be available for consumption
13 on the premises, by students, faculty, or staff of
14 the institution or their guests.

15 Sec. 4. Section 30-41 of the general
16 statutes, as amended, is amended by adding
17 subdivision (w) as follows: University permit,
18 two hundred forty dollars.

19 Sec. 5. Section 30-38 of the 1969 supplement
20 to the general statutes is repealed and the
21 following is substituted in lieu thereof: Each
22 permit granted under the provisions of sections

23 30-16, 30-17, 30-20, 30-21, 30-22, 30-23, 30-24a,
24 30-26, 30-28, 30-29, [or] 30-36 OR SECTION 1 OF
25 THIS ACT shall also, under the regulations of the
26 commission, allow the storage of sufficient
27 quantities of alcoholic liquor respectively
28 allowed to be sold under such permits as may be
29 necessary for the business conducted by the
30 respective permittees or their backers; but no
31 such permit shall be granted under the provisions
32 of section 30-16 or 30-17 unless such storage
33 facilities are provided and the place of storage
34 receives the approval of the commission as to
35 suitability, and thereafter no place of storage
36 shall be changed nor any new place of storage
37 utilized without the approval of the commission.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Assembly convened:

Section 1. A university permit shall allow the retail sale
of beer on land and in buildings which are subject to the care,
custody and control of the governing board of any college or
university. Such beverages shall be available for consumption on
the premises, by students, faculty, or staff of the institution
or their guests.

Sec. 2. Section 30-41 of the general statutes is repealed
and the following is substituted in lieu thereof: The fees per
annum for permits under this chapter shall be as follows: (a) (1)
Manufacturer permit, sixteen hundred dollars, or (2) manufacturer
permit for beer only, eight hundred dollars, or (3) manufacturer
permit for apple brandy, three hundred twenty dollars; (b) (1)
wholesaler permit, twenty-four hundred dollars, or (2) wholesaler
permit for beer only, eight hundred dollars; (c) (1) package
store liquor permit, four hundred dollars, (2) package store beer
permit, eighty dollars, (3) grocery store beer permit, eighty
dollars; (d) hotel permit, (1) in towns having a population
according to the last-preceding United States census of ten
thousand or less, twelve hundred dollars, (2) in all other towns
so having a population of fifty thousand or less, sixteen hundred
dollars, and (3) in all other towns, twenty-four hundred dollars,

(4) hotel permit for beer only, two hundred forty dollars; (e) 39
 (1) restaurant permit, twelve hundred dollars, (2) restaurant 40
 permit for beer only, two hundred forty dollars, (3) restaurant 41
 wine and beer permit, five hundred sixty dollars; (f) club
 permit, two hundred forty dollars; (g) tavern permit, two hundred 42
 forty dollars; (h) railroad permit, four hundred dollars; (i) 43
 boat permit, four hundred dollars; (j) (1) druggist permit, four 44
 hundred dollars, (2) druggist permit for beer only, eighty 45
 dollars; (k) temporary permit for beer only, fifteen dollars per 46
 day; (l) (1) warehouse bottling permit, one hundred sixty 47
 dollars, (2) warehouse storage permit, thirty-five dollars; (m) 48
 concession permit for the period of one year, two hundred forty
 dollars; for the period of six months, one hundred sixty dollars, 49
 and for one day, fifteen dollars; (n) manufacturer permit for 50
 cider, one hundred sixty dollars; (o) out-of-state shipper's 51
 permit for alcoholic liquors, forty-five dollars; (p) out-of- 52
 state shipper's permit for beer only, the fee shall be the same 53
 as the state of manufacture of the applicant shall assess 54
 Connecticut manufacturers of beer to exercise like privileges
 within the state of the applicant; (q) broker's permit, one 55
 hundred sixty dollars; (r) military permit, fifteen dollars; (s) 56
 UNIVERSITY PERMIT, TWO HUNDRED FORTY DOLLARS. Any of said 57
 permits, except a temporary permit, may be granted for a 58
 continuous period of not more than six consecutive calendar 59
 months, at two-thirds of said regular fees, but there shall be no 60
 rebate for any unexpired portion of the term of a permit revoked 61
 by reason of a violation of any provision of this chapter. The 62
 population of cities and towns used in this section shall be
 predicated upon the last-preceding United States census; (s) golf 63
 country club permit, eight hundred dollars; (t) cafe permit, 64
 seventeen hundred fifty dollars; (u) nonprofit theater permit, 65
 two hundred dollars.

Sec. 3. Section 30-38 of the 1969 supplement to the general 66
 statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu 67
 thereof: Each permit granted under the provisions of sections 68

30-16, 30-17, 30-20, 30-21, 30-22, 30-23, 30-24a, 30-26, 30-28, 68
 30-29, [or] 30-36 OR SECTION 1 OF THIS ACT shall also, under the 69
 regulations of the commission, allow the storage of sufficient 70
 quantities of alcoholic liquor respectively allowed to be sold 71
 under such permits as may be necessary for the business conducted 72
 by the respective permittees or their backers; but no such permit 73
 shall be granted under the provisions of section 30-16 or 30-17 74
 unless such storage facilities are provided and the place of 75
 storage receives the approval of the commission as to 76
 suitability, and thereafter no place of storage shall be changed
 or any new place of storage utilized without the approval of the
 commission.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE: To permit the liquor control commission to 79
 issue permits for the retail sale of beer in buildings of a 80
 university or college and to provide for a charge of two hundred 81
 forty dollars for such a permit.
