AN ACT CONCERNING CLAIMS AGAINST THE STATE.

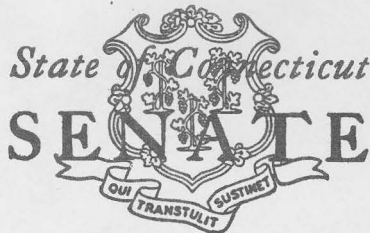
Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 3-117 of the general statutes is
2 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu
3 thereof: Upon the settlement of any claim against
4 the state, the comptroller shall draw an order on
5 the treasurer for its payment; but each such claim
6 shall be SUBMITTED DIRECTLY TO THE AGENCY WHICH
7 ORDERED OR RECEIVED THE ARTICLES OR SERVICE FOR
8 WHICH SUCH CLAIM WAS MADE, WHICH AGENCY SHALL
9 CERTIFY THAT SUCH ARTICLES OR SERVICES HAVE BEEN
10 RECEIVED OR PERFORMED AND supported by the signed
11 statement of the party presenting it that it is
12 just and correct, that the whole labor has been
13 performed or the articles furnished and that no
14 commission, discount, bonus, reward or present of
15 any kind has been promised, received or expected
16 on account thereof by any officer of the state,
17 and shall also be supported by vouchers or
18 receipts for the payment of any money exceeding
19 five dollars at any one time, and an accurate
20 account, showing the items of such claim, and a
21 detailed account of expenses, when expenses
22 constitute a portion of it, specifying the day
23 when and purpose for which they were incurred; and

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24 the original vouchers or receipts shall be filed
25 in the comptroller's office.



Senate, May 4, 1971. The Committee on Government Administration and Policy reported through Senator Sullivan of the 16th District, Chairman of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

14 TO THE BEST KNOWLEDGE OF THE CERTIFYING AGENT no
15 commission, discount, bonus, reward or present of
16 any kind has been promised, received or expected
17 on account thereof by any officer of the state,
18 and shall also be supported by vouchers or
19 receipts for the payment of any money exceeding
20 five dollars at any one time, and an accurate
21 account, showing the items of such claim, and a
22 detailed account of expenses, when expenses
23 constitute a portion of it, specifying the day

24 when and purpose for which they were incurred; and
25 the original vouchers or receipts shall be filed
26 in the comptroller's office.

OFFICER OF THE STATE OR AGENCY, vouchers or receipts for the 32
payment of any money exceeding five dollars at any one time, and 33
an accurate account, showing the items of such claim, and a 34
detailed account of expenses, when expenses constitute a portion 35
of it, specifying the day when and purpose for which they were 36
incurred; and the original vouchers or receipts shall be filed in 36
the comptroller's office. 37
