AN ACT CONCERNING BOARDS OF TRUSTEES FOR THE REGIONAL COMMUNITY 15 COLLEGES. CONNECTICUT

STATE LIBRARY LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE SECTION

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in 17 General Assembly convened: 18

Section 1. There shall be boards of trustees for each 19 regional community college, including greater Hartford cummunity 20 college, Housatonic community college, Manchester community 21 community college, Middlesex community college, Mattatuck college, Northwestern community college, Norwalk community 22 college, Mohegan community college, South Central community 23 college and Tunxis community college. On the first day of July, 24 1971, the powers of the existing board of trustees for the 25 regional community colleges shall be transferred to the boards of trustees for each existing community college. 26

27 Sec. 2. The governor shall appoint four trustees to each board of trustees for the regional community colleges now in 28 existence and the trustees so appointed shall hold office for a 29 period of five years. On July 1, 1971, the governor shall 30 appoint said trustees for staggered terms, one term to run until 31 July, 1973, one term to run until July, 1974, one term to run until July, 1975, and one term to run until July, 1976. The 33 trustees so appointed by the governor shall be residents of the district which the community college serves and shall be selected 34 from a list of names submitted to the governor by the mayor and 35 first selectman of the towns included in the region for each 36 community college. The commissioner of higher education shall be 37

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ex officio, a member of the boards of trustees for the regional 38 community colleges. After a regional community college has been 39 in existence for five years, the graduates of that college shall 40 prior to July 1 in the odd-numbered years, elect two trustees who 41 shall hold office for two years from the first day of July succeeding his election. One student trustee shall also be 42 elected to each board by the general student body of each 43 regional community college to serve for a one year term beginning in July, 1971.

Sec. 3. Each board shall, within its own jurisdiction 44 administer the regional community college in its region subject 45 to the powers of the commission on higher education. The 47 board may lease such physical facilities as may be necessary for proper operation of such institution, subject to the approval of the 48 commission on higher education and may expend capital funds 49 therefor if such leasing is required during the planning and 50 construction phases of the institution within its jurisdiction for which such capital funds were authorized. The board may 52 appoint and remove the chief executive officer of the institution within its jurisdiction. The board may employ the faculty and 54 other personnel needed to operate and maintain the institution 55 within its jurisdiction. Within the limits of available 56 appropriations the board shall fix the compensation of such 57 personnel, establish terms and conditions of employment and prescribe their duties and qualifications subject to the powers 58 of the commission on higher education. The boards shall confer 59 such certificates and degrees as are appropriate to the curricula 60 of the community college within its region. Within the limits of 61 the bonding authority therefor the board may acquire such site 62 and construct such buildings as are consistent with the plan of development approved by the commission. 63

Sec. 4. Section 10-38f of the 1969 supplement to the 64 general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in 65 lieu thereof: The [board] BOARDS of trustees [of] FOR EACH 66 regional community [colleges] COLLEGE may establish and maintain 67

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a community college auxiliary services at the regional community 67 colleges as said board determines. The proceeds of such 69 activities shall become a part of the resources of said fund. All direct expenses of operation, maintenance and repair of 70 facilities, food services and such other auxiliary activities 71 shall be charged, and any payments of interest and principal of 72 bonds or any sums transferable to any fund for the payment of interest and principal of bonds and any cost of equipment for 73 such operations may be charged, against such fund on order of the 74 state comptroller. Any balance of receipts above expenditures 75 shall remain in said fund to be used for the improvement and 76 extension of said activities, except such sums as may be required be transferred from time to time to any fund for the to 77 redemption of bonds and payment of interest on bonds. 78

Sec. 5. Section 10-38g of the 1969 supplement to the 79 general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in 80 lieu thereof: The [board] BOARDS of trustees [of] FOR EACH 81 regional community [colleges] COLLEGE may establish and maintain 82 [a] community college education extension funds. [Said fund] 83 SUCH FUNDS may be used as [said board determines] SUCH BOARDS DETERMINE for the operation of such regional community college 84 educational extension programs and summer school sessions as said 85 board may establish and for the purchase of such equipment as is 86 required for use in the operation of such programs and sessions. All proceeds derived from the operation of the educational 87 extension programs and of the summer school sessions shall be 88 credited to and become a part of the resources of [said fund.] 89 SUCH FUNDS. All direct expenses incurred in the conduct of said 90 educational extension programs and summer sessions shall be 91 charged, and any payments of interest and principal of bonds or 92 any sums transferable to any fund for the payment of interest and principal of bonds and any cost of equipment for such operations 93 may be charged against said fund on order of the state 94 comptroller. Any balance of receipts above expenditures shall 95 remain in [said fund] SUCH FUNDS to be used for its educational 96

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extension program and summer school session program, and for the 97 acquisition, as provided by section 4-26, alteration and repairs of real property for educational extension facilities, except 98 such sums as may be required to be transferred from time to time 99 to any fund for the redemption of bonds and payment of interest 100 on bonds, provided capital projects costing over fifty thousand dollars shall require the approval of the general assembly or, 101 when the general assembly is not in session, of the finance 102 advisory committee.

Sec. 6. Section 10-38h of the 1969 supplement to the 103 general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in 104 lieu thereof: The [board] BOARDS of trustees [of the] FOR EACH 105 regional community [colleges] COLLEGE shall fix fees for tuition 106 and for such other purposes as the board deems necessary at such colleges, subject to the approval of the commission for higher 107 education, and may make refunds of the same. [Said board] SUCH 109 BOARDS may remit tuition fees of deserving students of exceptional promise, provided the fees of not more than ten per 110 cent of such students in each class each year shall be so remitted.

Sec. 7.Section 10-38b, 10-38c and 10-38d of the 1969112supplement to the general statutes are repealed.113

Sec. 8. This act shall take effect from its passage. 114

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE: To provide for a separate board of trustees 117 for each of the regional community colleges instead of the board 118 of trustees for all colleges.
