AN ACT CONCERNING THE TERMINATION OF CERTAIN GROUP HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 No carrier of group health insurance which
- 2 extends coverage to the dependents of an insured
- 3 may terminate the coverage of any such dependent
- 4 unless such carrier has so notified the insured,
- 5 by first class mail, not less than ninety days
- 6 prior to the effective date of such termination.

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AN ACT CONCERNING THE TERMINATION OF HEALTH INSURANCE.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

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No carrier of group health insurance which extends coverage to dependents may terminate the coverage of any dependent unless such carrier has notified such dependent and his parent or guardian by first class mail ninety days prior to the effective date of such termination.

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STATEMENT OF PURPOSE: To prevent the termination of health insurance of any dependent covered under a group policy without written notice.
