Substitute Senate Bill No. 1700



Senate, May 12, 1971. The Committee on General Law reported through Senator Strada of the 27th District, Chairman of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING THE UNLAWFUL DESTRUCTION OR DISTURBANCE OF SURVEYOR'S MARKERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Any person who knowingly injures, destroys,
- 2 disturbs or removes any marker placed on any tract
- 3 of land by a surveyor, or by any person at the
- 4 direction of a surveyor, for the purpose of
- 5 designating any point, course or line in the
- 6 boundary of such tract of land, shall be fined not
- 7 more than fifty dollars.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Assembly convened:

Any person who knowingly destroys or disturbs any marker
placed on any land by a surveyor or by any other person at the
instruction of a surveyor shall be fined not more than five
hundred dollars.
