AN ACT CONCERNING THE UNLAWFUL DESTRUCTION OR DISTURBANCE OF SURVEYOR'S MARKERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Any person who knowingly injures, destroys, disturbs or removes any marker placed on any tract of land by a surveyor, or by any person at the direction of a surveyor, for the purpose of designating any point, course or line in the boundary of such tract of land, shall be fined not more than fifty dollars.
