Senate, April 20, 1971. The Committee on Public Health & Safety reported through Senator Pac of the 6th District, Chairman of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING THE SALE OF ABANDONED OR UNUSED CEMETERY LOTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened: Section 19-158 of the general statutes is 1 2 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu 3 thereof: ANY TOWN OR any mutual nonstock cemetery 4 association or corporation having charges legally 5 assessed against any lot in the cemetery under its 6 control or any holder of any such lot which have 7 been due and unpaid for at least ten years shall 8 be authorized to sell the unused portion of such 9 lot in such manner as its LEGISLATIVE BODY OR 10 governing board, AS THE CASE MAY BE, may direct, 11 provided a notice shall be sent by registered or 12 certified mail to any such lot-holder and any 13 other person known to be beneficially interested 14 in any such lot, at the last-known address of such 15 lot-holder or other person, which notice shall 16 substantially contain the information that, if 17 such legally assessed charges are not paid within 18 a year from the date of the issuance of such 19 notice, such TOWN, cemetery association or 20 corporation may take over any unused portion of 21 such lot for the purpose of sale, provided space 22 shall be reserved for the surviving spouse, if

23 any, of the original lot-holder, if the surviving 24 spouse would otherwise be eligible for burial in 25 such cemetery under the rules and regulations 26 governing burials in such cemetery. If such TOWN, 27 association or corporation is unable to determine 28 any person known to be beneficially interested in 29 any such lot, it shall cause to be published, in 30 a newspaper having a circulation in the town in 31 which the cemetery is located, at least once a 32 week for three consecutive weeks, a notice 33 containing the same information as is sent to any 34 known lot-holder or person known to be 35 beneficially interested. The proceeds from the 36 sale of such unused portion of such lots shall 37 first be used to reimburse such TOWN, association 38 or corporation for any past due charges and costs 39 of sale. The balance shall be placed in a 40 perpetual care fund, the interest from which shall 41 be expended in the care of such uncared-for lots 42 in such cemetery as are designated by the 43 LEGISLATIVE BODY OF SUCH TOWN OR THE governing 44 board of such cemetery, AS THE CASE MAY BE.

AN ACT CONCERNING THE SALE OF ABANDONED OR UNUSED CEMETERX LOTSCUT 14 STATE LIBRARY

LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE

SECTION

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in 16 General Assembly convened: 17

Section 19-158 of the general statutes is repealed and the 18 following is substituted in lieu thereof: ANY TOWN OR any mutual 19 nonstock cemetery association or corporation having charges 20 legally assessed against any lot in the cemetery under its 21 control or any holder of any such lot which have been due and unpaid for at least ten years shall be authorized to sell the 22 unused portion of such lot in such manner as its LEGISLATIVE BODY 23 OR governing board AS THE CASE MAY BE, may direct, provided a 24 notice shall be sent by registered or certified mail to any such 25 lot-holder and any other person known to be beneficially interested in any such lot, at the last-known address of such 26 lot-holder or other person, which notice shall substantially 27 contain the information that, if such legally assessed charges 28 are not paid within a year from the date of the issuance of such 29 notice, such TOWN, cemetery association or corporation may take over any unused portion of such lot for the purpose of sale, 30 provided space shall be reserved for the surviving spouse, if 31 any, of the original lot-holder, if the surviving spouse would 32 otherwise be eligible for burial in such cemetery under the rules 33 and regulations governing burials in such cemetery. If such TOWN, association or corporation is unable to determine any 34 person known to be beneficially interested in any such lot, it 35 shall cause to be published, in a newspaper having a circulation

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in the town in which the cemetery is located, at least once a 36 week for three consecutive weeks, a notice containing the same 37 information as is sent to any known lot-holder or person known to 38 be beneficially interested. The proceeds from the sale of such 39 unused portion of such lots shall first be used to reimburse such TOWN, association or corporation for any past due charges and 40 costs of sale. The balance shall be placed in a perpetual care 41 fund, the interest of which shall be expended in the case of such 42 uncared-for lots in such cemetery as are designated by the 43 LEGISLATIVE BODY OF SUCH TOWN or the governing board of such cemetery, AS THE CASE MAY BE. 44

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE: To authorize towns to sell the unused 47 portion of abandoned cemetery lots. 48
