Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in 16 General Assembly convened: 17

18 Section 9-135 of the 1969 supplement to the Section 1. general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in 19 lieu thereof: Any elector who is unable to appear at his polling 20 place during the hours of voting of any state, municipal or 21 special election, (1) because of absence from the [state] TOWN OF 22 HIS VOTING RESIDENCE during all of the hours between the opening 23 of the polls in the town [of his voting residence] in the morning 24 and the closing thereof in the evening of the day of such 25 election, or (2) [because of absence from the town of his voting 26 residence during all of such hours because of his status 27 20 student in a college, university, nurses' training school or any 28 other institution of higher learning located within this 29 state other than such town of his voting residence, or because he is the spouse of, and lives with, such a student, or (3) because of 30 absence from the town of his voting residence during all of such 31 hours because he has a temporary place of abode in a town other 32 than the town of his voting residence because of membership in a 33 religious community, or [(4) because of absence during all of 34 such hours from the town in which he qualifies for and has 35 requested a continuance of his registration under section 9-40, or [(5)] (3) because of illness, or [(6)] (4) because of physical 36 disability, or [(7)] (5) because the tenets of his religion 37 forbid secular activity, may cause his vote to be cast at such 38

election, in the manner and subject to the conditions hereinafter stated.

Sec. 2. Section 9-137 of said supplement is repealed and 40 the following is substituted in lieu thereof: Such absentee 42 ballot shall be returned to the municipal clerk, inserted in an 43 inner envelope which shall have endorsed on the face thereof form containing statements as follows: "I, the undersigned, do 44 hereby state under the penalties of perjury (1) that I am a 45 citizen of the United States, and a resident and elector, or have 46 made application to become an elector, of the town, city or 47 borough of .... in the state of Connecticut, in which town, city 48 or borough I desire to vote; (2) that I expect to be absent from 49 the town of my voting residence [during the hours of voting of the day of election at which the enclosed ballot is to be cast 50 because of membership in the armed forces; or that I expect to be 51 absent from the state] during all of the hours between the 52 opening of the polls in the town [of my voting residence] in the 53 morning and the closing thereof in the evening of the day of such 54 election; [or that I expect to be absent from the town of my 55 voting residence during all of such hours because of my status as 56 a student in a college, university, nurses' training school or any other institution of higher learning located within 57 Connecticut other than such town of my voting residence; or that 58 I expect to be absent from the town of my voting residence during 59 all of such hours because I am the spouse of, and live with, such 60 a student; or that I expect to be absent from the town of my 61 voting residence during all of such hours because I have a 62 temporary place of abode in a town other than the town of my voting residence because of my membership in a religious 63 community;] or that I expect to be absent during all of such 64 hours from the town in which I qualify for and have requested a 65 or continuance of my registration under section 9-40; that I 66 be unable to appear at my polling place on the day of 67 expect to such election by reason of illness or physical disability; or because the tenets of my religion forbid secular activity on the 68

day of such election.

Dated this ....(day) of ....(month)....(year) 72 ....(Elector's Signature)." The municipal clerk, before issuance 73 of the ballot and envelopes to an absentee ballot applicant, 74 shall inscribe the name of the town, city or borough, in the 75 space provided therefor, in the foregoing form.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect with respect to all 76 elections held after January 1, 1972. 77

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE: To extend the absentee voting privilege to 80 persons who will be absent from the town of their voting 81 residences during all hours of voting on election day 82 irrespective of the reason for their absence. 83
