Senate, April 29, 1971. The Committee on Judiciary reported through Senator Jackson of the 5th District, Chairman of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING PERSONS DETAINED WHO HAVE MADE BAIL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of

Representatives in General Assembly convened: No person who has not made bail shall be 2 detained in a community correction center pursuant 3 to the issuance of a bench warrant or for 4 arraignment, sentencing or trial for an offense 5 not punishable by death, for a period longer than 6 forty-five days from such arrest, arraignment, 7 conviction or previous presentment, 8 presented to the court having cognizance of the 9 offense. Such court may reduce, modify or

10 discharge such bail, or may for cause shown remand 11 such person to the custody of the commissioner of

12 correction.
