



Senate, April 27, 1971. The Committee on Liquor Control reported through Senator Dupont of the 29th District, Chairman of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CREATING A CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION PERMIT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Section 30-1 of the general
2 statutes, as amended, is amended by adding
3 subdivision (26) as follows: "Charitable
4 organization" means any nonprofit organization
5 organized for charitable purposes to which has
6 been issued a ruling by the Internal Revenue
7 Service classifying it as an exempt organization
8 under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue
9 Code.

10 Sec. 2. Section 30-15 of the general
11 statutes, as amended, is amended by adding
12 subdivision (u) as follows: Charitable
13 organization permit.

14 Sec. 3. A charitable organization permit
15 shall allow the retail sale of alcoholic liquor by
16 the drink to be consumed on the premises owned or
17 leased by the organization. Such permit shall be
18 issued on a daily basis subject to the hours of
19 sale in section 5 of this act and only four such
20 permits shall be issued to the same charitable
21 organization in any calendar year.

22 Sec. 4. Section 30-41 of the general
23 statutes, as amended, is amended by adding

24 subdivision (w) as follows: Charitable
25 organization permit, twenty-five dollars.
26 Sec. 5. Section 30-91 of the 1969 supplement
27 to the general statutes is repealed and the
28 following is substituted in lieu thereof: The sale
29 or the dispensing or consumption or the presence
30 in glasses or other receptacles suitable to permit
31 the consumption of liquor by an individual of
32 alcoholic liquor in places operating under hotel
33 permits, restaurant permits, cafe permits, club
34 permits, [and] golf country club permits AND
35 CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION PERMITS shall be unlawful
36 on the day of any state or municipal election
37 during the hours of voting, and on Sunday after
38 one a.m., Good Friday or Christmas, except when
39 any Sunday is December thirty-first or January
40 first, and except that any town may, by a vote of
41 a town meeting or by ordinance, (a) allow the sale
42 of alcoholic liquor on Sunday between the hours of
43 twelve o'clock noon and nine o'clock in the
44 evening in hotels, restaurants, cafes, clubs and
45 golf country clubs AND PLACES OPERATING UNDER
46 CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION PERMITS and (b) prohibit
47 the sale of alcoholic liquor from twelve o'clock
48 midnight on Saturday until one a.m. on Sunday;
49 and such sale or dispensing or consumption or
50 presence in glasses or other receptacles suitable
51 to permit the consumption of alcoholic liquor by
52 an individual shall be unlawful on any other day
53 between the hours of one o'clock a.m. and nine
54 o'clock a.m., except that such sale shall be
55 lawful on January first until three o'clock in the
56 morning. When any Sunday falls on December
57 thirty-first or January first, sale of alcoholic
58 liquor in any club, golf cuntry club, restaurant,
59 cafe, [or] hotel OR PLACE OPERATING UNDER A
60 CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION PERMIT shall not begin
61 before twelve o'clock noon. Any town may, by vote
62 of a town meeting or by ordinance, reduce the
63 number of hours during which such sale shall be
64 permissible. The sale or dispensing of alcoholic
65 liquor in places operating under package store
66 permits, package store beer permits, drug store
67 permits, drug store beer permits or grocery store
68 beer permits shall be unlawful on the day of any
69 state or municipal election, on Good Friday,
70 Decoration Day, Thanksgiving Day, New Year's Day,
71 Sunday or Christmas or, if Decoration Day,

72 Christmas or New Year's Day occurs on a Sunday, on
73 the Monday next following such day; and such sale
74 or dispensing of alcoholic liquor in places
75 operating under package store permits, package
76 store beer permits, drug store permits, drug store
77 beer permits and grocery store beer permits shall
78 be unlawful on any other day before eight o'clock
79 a.m. and after eight o'clock p.m. Any town may,
80 by a vote of a town meeting or by ordinance,
81 reduce the number of hours during which such sale
82 shall be permissible. The sale or the dispensing
83 or consumption or the presence in glasses or other
84 receptacles suitable to permit the consumption of
85 liquor by an individual of alcoholic liquor in
86 places operating under a tavern permit shall be
87 unlawful on the day of any state or municipal
88 election during the hours of voting, on Sunday
89 after one a.m., Good Friday or Christmas; and such
90 sale or dispensing or consumption or presence in
91 glasses or other receptacles in such tavern shall
92 be unlawful on any other day between the hours of
93 one o'clock a.m. and nine o'clock a.m. Any town
94 may, by a vote of a town meeting or by ordinance,
95 reduce the number of hours during which such sale
96 shall be permissible or prohibit the sale of
97 alcoholic liquor from twelve o'clock midnight on
98 Saturday until one a.m. on Sunday. In the case
99 of any tavern wherein, under the provisions of
100 this section, the sale of alcoholic liquor is
101 forbidden on certain days or hours of the day, or
102 during the period when a tavern permit is
103 suspended, it shall likewise be unlawful to keep
104 such tavern open to, or permit it to be occupied
105 by, the public on such days or hours. In all
106 cases when a town, either by vote of a town
107 meeting or by ordinance, has acted on the sale of
108 alcoholic liquors or the reduction of the number
109 of hours when such sale is permissible, such
110 action shall become effective on the first day of
111 the month succeeding such action and no further
112 action shall be taken until at least one year has
113 elapsed since the previous action was taken.

AN ACT CREATING A CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION PERMIT.

CONNECTICUT

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Assembly convened:

Section 1. Section 30-1 of the general statutes, as
amended, is amended by adding subdivision (26) as follows:
"Charitable organization" means any nonprofit organization
organized for charitable purposes to which has been issued a
ruling by the Internal Revenue Service classifying it as an
exempt organization under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal
Revenue Code.

Sec. 2. Section 30-15 of the general statutes, as amended,
is amended by adding subdivision (u) as follows: Charitable
organization permit.

Sec. 3. A charitable organization permit shall allow the
retail sale of alcoholic liquor by the drink to be consumed on
the premises owned or leased by the organization. Such permit
shall be issued on a daily basis subject to the hours of sale in
section 5 of this act and only four such permits shall be issued
to the same charitable organization in any calendar year.

Sec. 4. Section 30-41 of the general statutes, as amended,
is amended by adding subdivision (w) as follows: Charitable
organization permit, twenty-five dollars.

Sec. 5. Section 30-91 of the 1969 supplement to the general
statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu
thereof: The sale or the dispensing or consumption or the
presence in glasses or other receptacles suitable to permit the

consumption of liquor by an individual of alcoholic liquor in 37
places operating under hotel permits, restaurant permits, cafe 38
permits, club permits, [and] golf country club permits AND 39
CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION PERMITS shall be unlawful on the day of
any state or municipal election during the hours of voting, and 41
on Sunday after one a.m., Good Friday or Christmas, except when 42
any Sunday is December thirty-first or January first, and except 43
that any town may, by a vote of a town meeting or by ordinance, 44
(a) allow the sale of alcoholic liquor on Sunday between the
hours of twelve o'clock noon and nine o'clock in the evening in 45
hotels, restaurants, cafes, clubs and golf country clubs AND 46
PLACES OPERATING UNDER CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION PERMITS and (b) 47
prohibit the sale of alcoholic liquor from twelve o'clock 48
midnight on Saturday until one a.m. on Sunday; and such sale or 49
dispensing or consumption or presence in glasses or other 50
receptacles suitable to permit the consumption of alcoholic 51
liquor by an individual shall be unlawful on any other day
between the hours of one o'clock a.m. and nine o'clock a.m., 53
except that such sale shall be lawful on January first until 54
three o'clock in the morning. When any Sunday falls on December 56
thirty-first or January first, sale of alcoholic liquor in any 57
club, golf country club, restaurant, cafe, [or] hotel OR PLACE 58
OPERATING UNDER A CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION PERMIT shall not begin 59
before twelve o'clock noon. Any town may, by vote of a town 61
meeting or by ordinance, reduce the number of hours during which
such sale shall be permissible. The sale or dispensing of 63
alcoholic liquor in places operating under package store permits, 64
package store beer permits, drug store permits, drug store beer 65
permits or grocery store beer permits shall be unlawful on the 66
day of any state or municipal election, on Good Friday, 67
Decoration Day, Thanksgiving Day, New Year's Day, Sunday or
Christmas or, if Decoration Day, Christmas or New Year's Day 68
occurs on a Sunday, on the Monday next following such day; and 69
such sale or dispensing of alcoholic liquor in places operating 70
under package store permits, package store beer permits, drug 71

store permits, drug store beer permits and grocery store beer 72
 permits shall be unlawful on any other day before eight o'clock 73
 a.m. and after eight o'clock p.m. Any town may, by a vote of a 75
 town meeting or by ordinance, reduce the number of hours during 76
 which such sale shall be permissible. The sale or the dispensing 78
 or consumption or the presence in glasses or other receptacles 79
 suitable to permit the consumption of liquor by an individual of 80
 alcoholic liquor in places operating under a tavern permit shall 81
 be unlawful on the day of any state or municipal election during 82
 the hours of voting, on Sunday after one a.m., Good Friday or 83
 Christmas; and such sale or dispensing or consumption or presence
 in glasses or other receptacles in such tavern shall be unlawful 84
 on any other day between the hours of one o'clock a.m. and nine 86
 o'clock a.m. Any town may, by a vote of a town meeting or by 88
 ordinance, reduce the number of hours during which such sale 89
 shall be permissible or prohibit the sale of alcoholic liquor 90
 from twelve o'clock midnight on Saturday until one a.m. on 91
 Sunday. In the case of any tavern wherein, under the provisions 93
 of this section, the sale of alcoholic liquor is forbidden on 94
 certain days or hours of the day, or during the period when a 95
 tavern permit is suspended, it shall likewise be unlawful to keep 96
 such tavern open to, or permit it to be occupied by, the public 97
 on such days or hours. In all cases when a town, either by vote 99
 of a town meeting or by ordinance, has acted on the sale of
 alcoholic liquors or the reduction of the number of hours when 100
 such sale is permissible, such action shall become effective on 101
 the first day of the month succeeding such action and no further 102
 action shall be taken until at least one year has elapsed since 103
 the previous action was taken.

Sec. 6. This act shall take effect July 1, 1971. 105

charitable organizations for four days in any year. 109
