AN ACT CONCERNING TICKET RESELLING.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. (NEW) (Effective from passage) The Commissioner of 1 2 Consumer Protection shall, not later than January 1, 2007, adopt 3 regulations in accordance with the provisions of chapter 54 of the 4 general statutes, to: (1) Impose civil penalties on persons who sell 5 counterfeit tickets to entertainment events, (2) establish refund and 6 return rights for buyers of tickets to entertainment events, including, 7 but not limited to, refunds for tickets received prior to an event when 8 such tickets are not for seats originally promised by a ticket seller, and 9 (3) prohibit on-site sales of tickets at the time an entertainment event is 10 taking place.

Sec. 2. Section 53-289 of the general statutes is repealed. (*Effective January 1, 2007*)

Statement of Purpose:

To repeal Connecticut's out of date ticket scalping law and to require the Commissioner of Consumer Protection to adopt consumer friendly regulations regarding ticket sales for entertainment events.
