AN ACT CONCERNING CAMP VEHICLES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Subsection (a) of section 14-44 of the 2006 supplement to
2 the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu
3 thereof (*Effective from passage*):

4 (a) (1) No person shall operate a commercial motor vehicle used for
5 passenger transportation on any public highway of this state until he
6 has obtained a commercial driver's license with a passenger
7 endorsement from the commissioner, except a nonresident who holds
8 such license with such endorsement issued by another state. (2) No
9 person shall operate a school bus until he has obtained a commercial
10 driver's license with a school bus endorsement, except that a person
11 who holds such a license without such endorsements may operate a
12 school bus without passengers for the purpose of road testing or
13 moving the vehicle. (3) No person shall operate a student
14 transportation vehicle, as defined in section 14-212, as amended,
15 activity vehicle, [camp vehicle,] taxicab, motor vehicle in livery service,
16 motor bus or service bus until he has obtained an operator's license
17 bearing an endorsement of the appropriate type from the
