AN ACT ESTABLISHING TOLL BOOTHS ON MAJOR HIGHWAYS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- Section 1. (Effective from passage) (a) The Commissioner of
- 2 Transportation, in consultation with the chairpersons and ranking 3 members of the joint standing committee of the General Assembly
- 4 having cognizance of matters relating to transportation and the
- Transportation Strategy Board, shall develop a plan for reinstating tolls 5
- 6 on Connecticut's major highways, specifically on Interstates 395, 95, 91
- and 84 at or near the borders of Connecticut and contiguous states. 8 Such plan shall, taking into account safety considerations, include
- 9 details for constructing gateway toll booths that make use of any
- 10 method or devise in the collection of such tolls that may contribute to
- 11 convenience and expedience in such collection, including electronic
- 12 vehicle identification tolls.
- 13 (b) The commissioner shall establish regulations pursuant to chapter
- 54 of the general statutes with regard to toll operation and rates as 14
- 15 established by subsection (a) of this section.
- 16 (c) Not later than January 1, 2007, the commissioner shall submit a

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- 17 report on its findings and recommendations, including, but not limited
- 18 to, recommendations for legislative action, to the joint standing
- 19 committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters
- 20 relating to transportation, in accordance with the provisions of section
- 21 11-4a of the general statutes.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
