AN ACT ESTABLISHING A COMMITTEE TO STUDY THE PROBLEM OF 14
DISPOSABLE CONTAINERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Assembly convened:
Section 1. There shall be a committee to study the 19 feasibility of banning or taxing the use of cans and other 20 containers which are not reusable or returnable. Said committee 21 shall consist of one member of the senate appointed by the 22 president pro tempore of the senate, one member of the house of 23 representatives appointed by the speaker of the house, three 24 electors of the state appointed by the governor, one of whom shall be a member of an industry which manufactures or 25 distributes products in such containers; and one member to be 26 appointed by the commissioners of each of the following 27 departments: Consumer protection, community affairs, health, and 28 agriculture and natural resources.

Sec. 2. The members of said committee shall be reimbursed 29 for necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their 30 duties. Said committee may employ such clerical and professional 31 assistance as is required to carry out the provisions of this 32 act.
