AN ACT CONCERNING THE AWARD OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION FOR SCARRING AND DISFIGUREMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. Subsection (c) of section 31-308 of the general statutes is
- 2 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (Effective
- 3 October 1, 2006):
- 4 (c) In addition to compensation for total or partial incapacity or for a 5 specific loss of a member or use of the function of a member of the
- 6 body, the commissioner, not earlier than one year from the date of the
- 7 injury and not later than two years from the date of the injury or the
- 8 surgery date of the injury, may award compensation equal to seventy-
- 9 five per cent of the average weekly earnings of the injured employee,
- 10 calculated pursuant to section 31-310, <u>as amended</u>, after such earnings
- 11 have been reduced by any deduction for federal or state taxes, or both,
- 12 and for the federal Insurance Contributions Act made from such
- 13 employee's total wages received during the period of calculation of the
- 14 employee's average weekly wage pursuant to [said] section 31-310, as
- 15 amended, but not more than one hundred per cent, raised to the next
- 16 even dollar, of the average weekly earnings of production and related

17 workers in manufacturing in the state, as determined in accordance 18 with the provisions of section 31-309, for up to two hundred eight 19 weeks, for any permanent significant disfigurement of, or permanent 20 significant scar on, [(A) the face, head or neck, or (B) on any other area 21 of the body which handicaps the employee in obtaining or continuing 22 to work. The commissioner may not award compensation under this 23 subsection when the disfigurement was caused solely by the loss of or 24 the loss of use of a member of the body for which compensation is 25 provided under subsection (b) of this section or for any scar resulting 26 from an inguinal hernia operation or any spinal surgery] any area of the body. In making any award under this subsection, the 27 28 commissioner shall consider (1) the location of the scar or disfigurement, (2) the size of the scar or disfigurement, (3) the visibility 29 30 of the scar or disfigurement due to hyperpigmentation or 31 depigmentation, whether hypertrophic or keloidal, (4) whether the 32 scar or disfigurement causes a tonal or textural skin change, causes 33 loss of symmetry of the affected area or results in noticeable bumps or depressions in the affected area, and (5) other relevant factors. 34 [Notwithstanding the provisions of this subsection, no compensation 35 36 shall be awarded for any scar or disfigurement which is not located on (A) the face, head or neck, or (B) any other area of the body which 37 38 handicaps the employee in obtaining or continuing to work.] In 39 addition to the requirements contained in section 31-297, the 40 commissioner shall provide written notice to the employer or the 41 employer's representative prior to any hearing held by the 42 commissioner to consider an award for any scar or disfigurement 43 under this subsection.
