necessitates the severance of his connection with the National Guard, where he has filled an arduous position with honor and great credit to himself, his company, and the state. Captain White entered the National Guard as a private in Battery D, in August, 1865, soon after his discharge from the army, was appointed first lieutenant September 8, 1865, and captain October 6, 1867, and has held the position from which he now retires for over thirteen years, declining promotion for which he seemed eminently fitted, desiring only to command a model company of the National Guard, ever at the front in drill and discipline, and always ready for any duty to which it might be called. As a company commander, Captain White has had but few, if any, equals, and he now retires with a record of faithful services and honorable and successful administration to which he may always refer with pride and satisfaction.

2. First Lieutenant Levi H. Hotchkiss, Company F, First regiment, C. N. G., is hereby ordered to warn the members of the said company to appear at their armory to nominate by ballot a captain and a second lieutenant, and in like manner make nominations for any vacancies in the commissioned officers of said company, occurring by reason of the nominations above ordered, and make return of the nominations so made to this office without delay.

Lieutenant Hotchkiss has warned a meeting of the company for next Monday evening to elect officers to fill the vacant position.

At the regular meeting of the company last evening the following resolution was unanimously passed:—

The commander-in-chief having accepted the resignation of Captain John L. White, for more than thirty years the commanding officer of the Hartford City Guard, we desire to place on record our estimation of his true worth as a soldier, officer and friend. Unselfishly devoted to the best interests of the company and the state which he has so long and faithfully served, we recognize that the high position held and degree of efficiency attained by the company are the results of the hard work and persistent efforts of our late commander for the continual advancement of the company.

While regretting the severance of our always pleasant relations by the removal of Captain White from the state, we would extend our congratulations on his promising business prospects, and assuring him of the earnest regard of the Hartford City Guard for the future prosperity of himself and family. We shall ever cherish with feelings of joy and gladness the memories of our long acquaintance with our gallant captain.

That we tender to Captain White a farewell reception to be given in the company parlors Thursday evening, Dec. 1st, and that the veterans of the company be invited to attend.

Resolved, That in the acceptance of the resignation of Second Lieutenant George E. Lee the members of this company lose a faithful and hard-working officer who was always at his post of duty furthering the interests of the Hartford City Guard. His retirement is received with regret, but it is the hope of his comrades that he may meet with that success in his future sphere, which he is entitled to and which he has won while with this command.

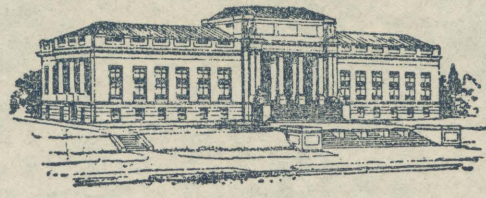
