The Cooley Inquest.

And one day there came a fearful explosion. The roof was torn off and reduced to splinters, and Thomas Cooley had disappeared.

There was by no means complete unanimity of opinion. The first jury decided that "the deceased met his death by being struck by something outside of his den," and advanced the theory that "Thomas Cooley was surreptitiously and insidiously blown apart." The others threw out suggestions respecting the probability that the trouble came from Cooley's well-known weakness for flying machines.

And then the coroner would disband the inquest and drum up a jury which would be down in investigating the explosion. The Cecil county coroner discovered six pieces of the deceased within his jurisdiction, but his pride would not let him yield the supremacy in such a matter to his rival over the line.

The Inspection of Steamboats.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18.—Supervising Inspector-General James A.
